Dear students and teachers in the UNESCO Baltic Sea Project,

At the end of summer 2018, the UNESCO Baltic Sea Project will hold a four-day international summer conference in the little town of Damp, in northern Germany, right on the coast of the Baltic Sea, with a blend of 330 participants from the nine countries of the UNESCO BSP and UNESCO ASPnet Germany.

The conference programme includes workshops, excursions, a cultural programme and much more, it starts on Tuesday, 18th September, at 16:00 h and ends on Friday, 21st September, at 14:00 h. The conference fee is 50,-- € for everyone. This includes accommodation, meals and most drinks and the whole conference programme. Travel expenses are not included. The conference language is English.

If you are a student and wish to participate, you should be between 15 and 19 years old, and we expect you to work on the tasks described on the following pages beforehand.

They are **not** about your country and **not** about the whole world. Please think about your school and the town where your school is located. There's probably a lot to describe and a lot to do.

Please send only **one** photo per task. Since there are three tasks, the maximum number of pictures you may send is three.

The maximum length of text for each task is 2000 characters, this makes a total of 6000 characters for all three written tasks.

All tasks are about the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) of the Agenda 2030, the full list is available on the last page of this document.

Here are your tasks:

Task 1:

Find an SDG that has been successfully achieved at your school.

- 1.1 Take a picture showing this.
- 1.2 Write a text that explains to what extent this SDG has successfully been achieved at your school.

Task 2:

Find an SDG which has **not** yet been achieved at your school, that needs to be worked on.

- 2.1 Take a picture showing this.
- 2.2 Write a text about the SDG that has not yet been achieved at your school. Explain why this is so.

Task 3:

How can you and your school achieve the SDG described in Task 2?

- 3.1 Write a text that explains this.
- 3.2 Add a photo that shows what you are going to do.

Very important: Be innovative, be creative, be realistic!

Remember the **deadline** for sending your work results to your National Coordinator: **Friday**, **2**nd **March**, **2018**


